35% of IT employers plan no change to their headcount in the second quarter of 2025



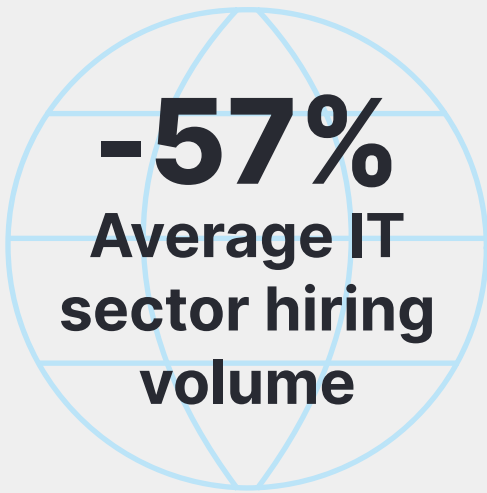
Among IT employers who are hiring, average hiring volume is set to decline by -57% vs Q1 2025



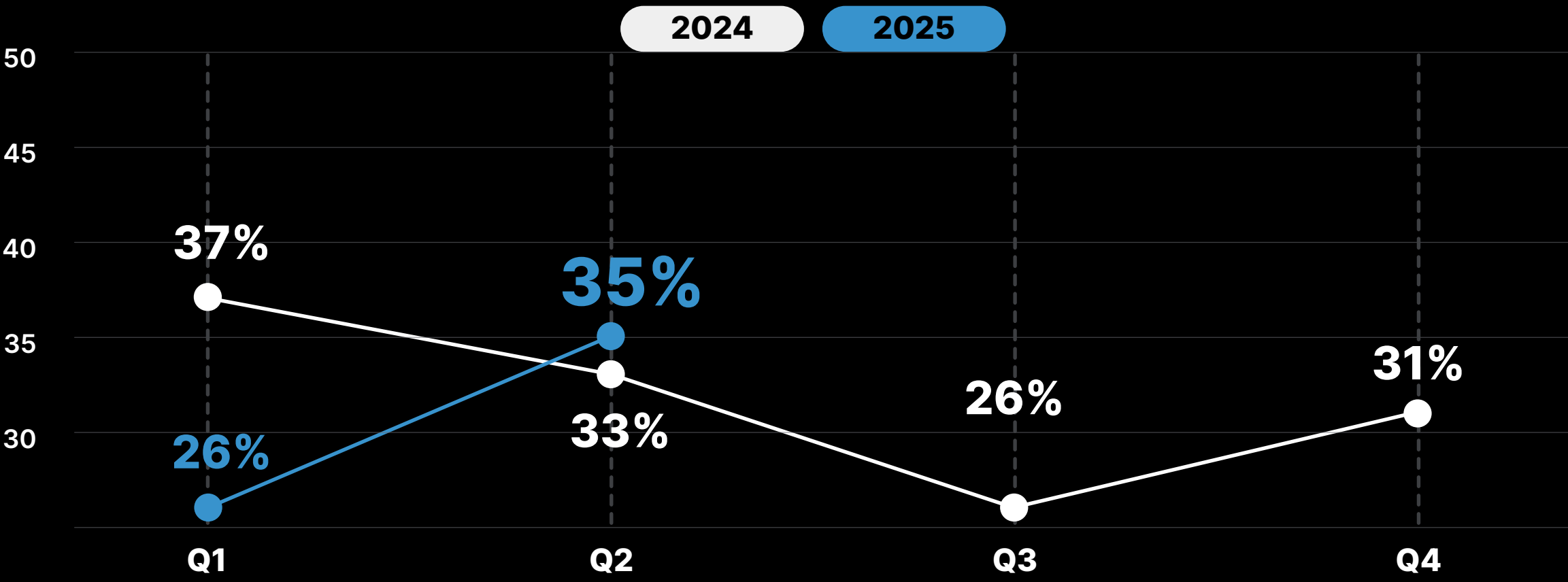
75% of IT employers report difficulty finding candidates with the skills they need

Over a third of UK IT industry plan no headcount changes

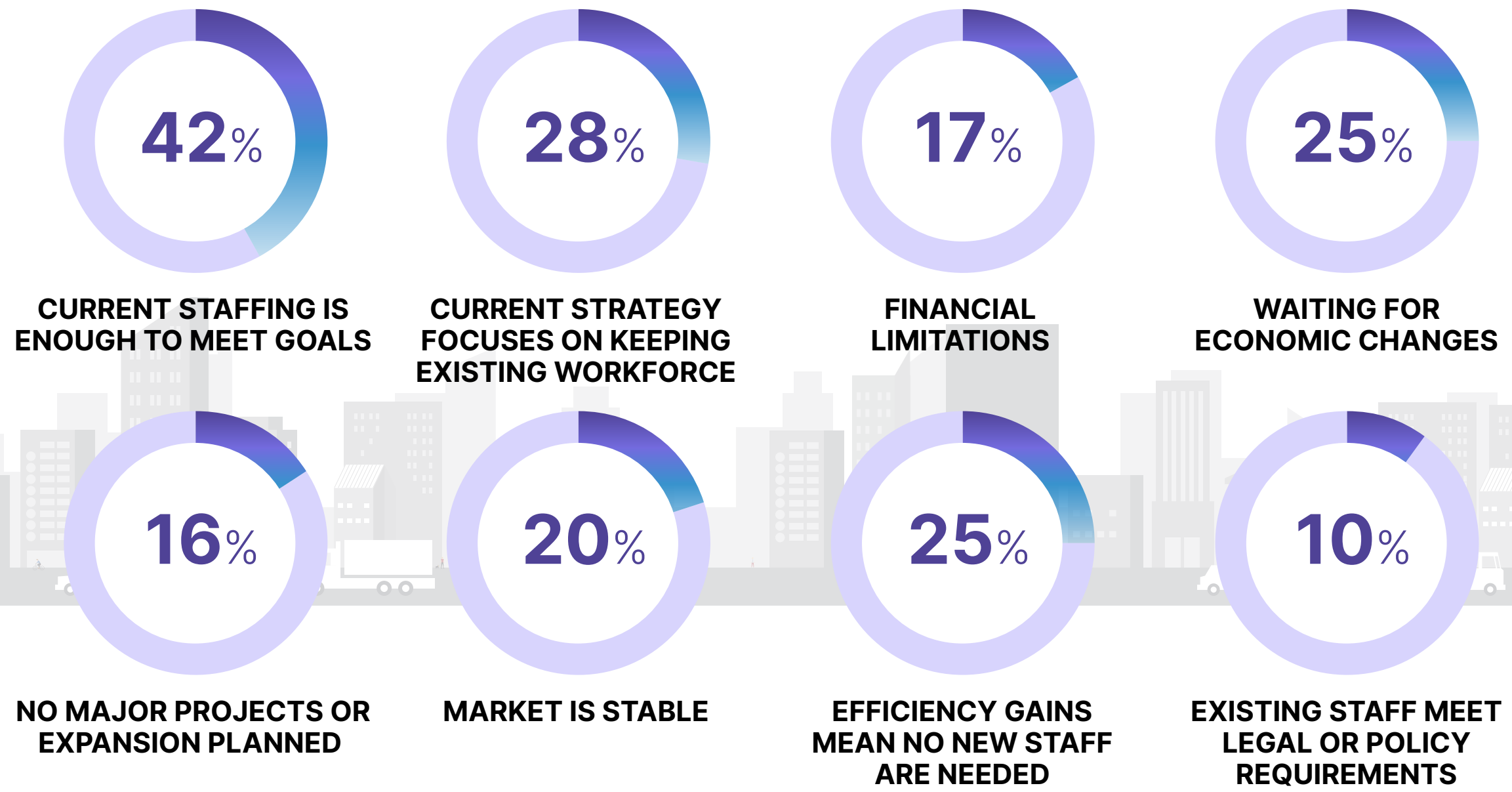
More than a third of businesses in the IT sector plan to leave headcounts unchanged going into Q2 (April – July 2025). Meanwhile, employers who have indicated plans to change headcount in the coming quarter report an **average -57% drop** in hiring volume.

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This research is based on results from the ManpowerGroup Employment Outlook Survey — the longest running, most comprehensive, forward-looking employment survey of its kind, used globally as a key labour market indicator.
